Dear Chief Secretary,

As you are aware that India is a signatory to the United Nations 2030 Agenda for achieving inclusive, people-centric and holistic Sustainable Development through 17 identified Goals. To this extent, the Government of India is operating with strategic visioning, prioritization and implementation methods to achieve Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) with the motto of "Leaving No One Behind", through "Whole of Government and Whole of Society" approach.

- You might be aware that here in Government of India, the Ministry of Minority Affairs implements different welfare schemes for the 6 notified minority communities. Among these, Scholarship Schemes hold the major stake that closely encompasses SDG 4- Quality Education, SDG-5 Gender Equality. It is highly essential to have inclusive development of a society wherein, Education plays a vital role. The Scholarship Schemes of Ministry of Minority Affairs thrives to give financial support to the aforesaid target group. However, though these schemes have been doing good in terms of benefiting the target groups, the proactive participation of rural society through the Gram Panchayats will be a value addition to the entire process. It is pertinent to mention that to facilitate the initiatives of a Gram Panchayat, the support of line departments in States, such as Education, Social Welfare, Minority Welfare, etc. and civil society organisations is highly solicited.
  - In this regard, it is stated that the meetings of Gram Panchayats have been held during the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav (AKAM) between April 11 to April 17, 2022, followed by 3. meeting of Gram Sabha on 24th April, 2022. It is suggested to all the States/UTs to make

necessary arrangements so that the Scholarship Schemes of this Ministry could be discussed at the village level at such meetings and the benefits of these Schemes get propagated amongst the needy. Special focus should be given to the border villages, identified under the "Vibrant Villages Programme", for propagating these Schemes. This would not only facilitate the villagers to understand the Scheme but would also help them to draw the Development Plans at the level of Gram Panchayat. The copy of guidelines is being attached herewith for your kind reference and wider dissemination.

- To fulfil the vision of Socially Secured Village of Department of Rural Development, 4. Govt. of India, socially inclusive education will play a major role wherein, the Scholarship Schemes of Ministry of Minority Affairs will appear as an agent of change in the minority concentrated areas. Thus, we have agreed to extend support in this convergence. Whereas, we also expect and hope similar convergence, coordination among the departments in your State including State HQs, District, Block, GP/village. The progress and implementation of these schemes may be monitored by a Committee constituted at the State, District level and Block level.
