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






PRIMARY TYPES OF SCHEMES/WORKS OF BLOCK & PANCHAYATS:

- Recurrent but Non-targeted
- Non-recurrent but Targeted
- Both Recurrent and Targeted



MAHATMA GANDHI & THE PIONEER OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT:

- "The future of India lies in its villages".
- "Gram Swaraj: India will be truly independent when its villages are independent."
- When the Panchayat Raj is established, public opinion will do what violence can never do.



PRE-INDEPENDENCE INDIA

- Rural Development mainly emerged as a part of Freedom Revolution
- Primarily focused on Agriculture, Farmer and allied sectors.
- Lack of focus on infrastructure, financial inclusion, employment generation, healthcare, basic amenities etc.





POST-INDEPENDENCE INDIA

- Rural Development became a priority.
- Efforts to uplift villages through land reforms, poverty alleviation programs and the establishment of Panchayati Raj Institutions.
- Schemes like MGNREGA, PMAY-G, Panchayati Funds, SBM(G), TRLM etc. have aimed at reducing inequalities and promoting sustainable livelihoods, marking a significant shift in approach.

MAJOR SCHEMES WHICH ARE IMPLEMENTED BY THE BLOCKS AND THE PANCHAYATI RAJ INSTITUTIONS

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MGNREGA

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MGNREGA (Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act)

Objectives:

- Provide 100 days of wage employment to rural households
- Enhance livelihood security
- Promote sustainable development through asset creation


Implementation:

- Key Roles: Job card issuance, project approval, wage disbursement

- Monitoring: Geotagging of assets, MIS entry, on-ground inspections

- Challenges: Delays in fund allocation, wage payments, lack of proper monitoring





<u>PMAY-G (Pradhan Mantri Awaas</u> <u>Yojana - Gramin)</u>

Objective:

- Provide pucca houses with basic amenities to the homeless and those living in kutcha houses

Key Aspects:

- Identification of Beneficiaries: SECC data, Grievance Redressal
- Fund Flow: Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) into beneficiaries accounts
- Role of Panchayats: Beneficiary selection, monitoring construction progress, and ensuring transparency
- Success Indicators: Number of houses completed, quality control and timely completion

















FFC (FIFTEENTHTH FINANCE COMMISSION) FUNDS

Role of Panchayats:

- Receive direct financial transfers from the Central Government
- Planning and executing development works like roads, water systems and other basic services

Accountability:

- Transparent fund utilization
- Monitoring through social audits and inspections

PANCHAYAT DEVELOPMENT FUND (PDF)

Purpose:

- Provide Panchayats with flexible funds to address local needs
 <u>Utilization:</u>
- Small infrastructure projects like community centers, drainage systems
- Maintenance of existing assets

Monitoring:

- Regular audits and utilization certificates



SWACHH BHARAT MISSION (GRAMEEN)

Objective:

- Primary objective was to Achieve Open Defecation Free (ODF) villages by providing individual household latrines
- ODF Plus aspires to achieve villages with SWM, LWM, Plastic Waste Management, Faecal Sludge Management compliant.

Implementation Approach:

- - Village-level IEC activities for behavioural change
- - Construction and monitoring of toilets in households
- - Convergence with MGNREGA for labour wage payments
- - Household level segregation of wastes

Challenges:

- Ensuring usage post-construction
- Progress tracking
 - Reluctance in behavioural change















Tripura Rural Livelihood Mission (TRLM)

Objective:

• Empower rural poor by promoting sustainable livelihood through SHGs and Village Organizations

Key Aspects:

- - Skill development and capacity building
- - Financial inclusion through bank linkages
- - Promoting livelihood activities like agriculture, handicrafts, and micro-enterprises

Role of Block & GP/VC:

- Ensuring SHGs are formed and supported
 - Convergence with other schemes for livelihood enhancement

OWN SOURCE REVENUE



- - Taxes: Property, water, etc.
- - Fees: Trade licenses, building approvals
- - Rent from Panchayat-owned properties

Importance:

- Strengthens financial autonomy
- - Enables Panchayats to address local needs independently

Role of Block and GP/VC:

• Encourage Panchayats to maximize revenue generation and maintain proper accounts



KEY CHALLENGES IN IMPLEMENTATION

- Lack of coordination between stakeholders
- Monitoring and supervision of works
- Resistance to change at grassroots level

BEST PRACTICES FOR EFFECTIVE SCHEME IMPLEMENTATION

- Regular meetings with Panchayat officials
- Capacity building of Panchayat Officials and Office bearers
- Transparency through MIS, Audits and public participation
- Leveraging technology for better monitoring

SOME OTHER MAJOR SCHEMES

Pradhan Mantri Anushuchit Jati Abhyuthan Yoajana (PMAJAY) -Aims to development of SC population through both infrastructural and income generating benefits.

Pradhan Mantri Aadi Adarsha Gram Yojana (PMAAGY) -Aims to development of ST population through both infrastructural and income generating benefits.

Bidhayak Elaka Unnayan Prokolpo (BEUP)- Aims to develop local need based infrastructure through Member of Legislative Assemblies. Aspirational Block: Aims for achieving holistic development of whole Block area with the altogether and convergent effort of District, Sub-Divisional, Block administration and Line Departments.


